

ORDINANCE NO. 190

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF THE CARLISLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT'S TAXIWAYS AND RUNWAYS AND THE USE OF THE LOADING PAD BY AERIAL AGRICULTURAL APPLICATORS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCE IN CONFLICT THERETO; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARLISLE, ARKANSAS

WHEREAS, in early 1990 an engineering study was conducted regarding the structural condition of the Carlisle Airport runways and taxiways; and,

WHEREAS, the engineering study concluded that excessive pavement surface damage had occurred due to the movement of heavily loaded motor vehicles on the runway and taxiways and the depositing of a variety of chemicals; and,

WHEREAS, it was determined that an emergency existed and that immediate action would be required if the Carlisle Municipal Airport was to remain in service; and,

WHEREAS, based on these findings the City of Carlisle acted promptly to solicit emergency funds from the Arkansas Department of Aeronautics which were matched with city funds for the purpose of restoring the structural integrity of the airport; and,

WHEREAS, protection of the airport is essential since emergency funds will no longer be available to the City; and,

THEREFORE, the City of Carlisle prohibits all motor vehicles except those approved by the FAA from driving upon taxiways and runways in the interest of avoiding further pavement damage.

FURTHER, no aerial agricultural applicator will be allowed to load planes except in designated loading pads and no spray solution or compounds will be discharged or deposited on runways or taxiways.

FURTHER, any company, firm or individual found guilty of violating this ordinance may be fined \$100 for the first offense, \$500 for the second offense, and for the 3rd offense a fine of \$500 plus suspension of operating out of the Carlisle Municipal Airport for a period of at least 60 days and not more than 180 days. In addition any company, firm or individual found guilty may be assessed the cost necessary to repair or clean up any damage done to the property.

WHEREAS, there is an immediate need for the enactment of this Ordinance to insure the protection of the Carlisle Municipal Airport; an emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance being necessary for the immediate protection of the public peace, health and safety shall take effect and be in force from and after it's passage and publication.
